UPDATE: STUDENT REVIVAL

Our last few nights in the first location were spent in rooms packed with university students. The leaders specifically request that I teach about and pray for the baptism in the Holy Spirit. No problem; that's like saying "sic em" to a bull dog.

I love teaching these young people because they come with such sincere questions; wanting to learn how to walk

with God. There is also one hard answer I must give. *What about the unsaved boyfriend or girlfriend they hope to marry?* For many girls to remain unmarried is a life failure. I saw tears fall down one young student's face this week as I counseled her with the Apostle Paul's command not be unequally yoked. She will pay a price to follow Jesus.

The college group has tripled since my last visit, and now meet in three locations.

Today I heard the testimony of a group I visited last year, where 6 new students were touched by God. They invited 24 more students the next meeting! This gives you a good idea of the potential for evangelism. **Lifeline Intl. partners sponsor the two gifted leaders of the University churches and I couldn't be more pleased with the results!**

Sunday, we traveled to another large city and immediately met with Church leaders. We are speaking each night to bible students, area pastors and church members. During the day the leaders come to our hotel to meet with us. **One pastor and his wife traveled overnight by train to spend the week with us.** They have been pastoring for just one week and were in great need of encouragement. The ministers of the devil's work of discouragement were the city's religious leaders and their own families. They also are paying a price.
